Devlac Hall Women's Residential Treatment Program of Behavioral Connections of Wood County serves women from all over Ohio. Women who are struggling with addictions to alcohol, tobacco, and other chemical substances are provided a safe haven in a smoke-free residence and treatment programming for a 10 week period of time. Residents learn about the disease of addiction, effects of use, the process of recovery, and learn to cope with mental health issues.

Each woman works towards goals such as:

- Understanding their addiction(s)
- Relapse prevention
- Recognizing dysfunctional interpersonal relationship patterns
- Building a sober support network



The treatment program includes individual and group counseling, lectures, other group activities, and women-specific education about relationships, sexual abuse, self-care and self-esteem.

Other issues addressed weekly are:

- Parenting
- Anger management
- Trauma recovery
- Nicotine dependence
- Vocational life skills
- Family education and counseling

Women are trained through workshops on:


- Domestic violence
- Personal safety
- Consumer credit
- HIV, AIDS, Hepatitis, and TB education
- Child abuse prevention

Medical issues are addressed with nursing care, and a medical doctor provides care to the residents weekly.

Treated by Professionals

The professional staff at Behavioral Connections work as a team and bring their individual resources together from various disciplines, including:

- Psychiatrists
- Addictionologists
- Licensed Counselors & Social Workers
- Licensed & Certified Addiction Counselors
- Nurses
- Dieticians
- GED Instructor



Certified Program

Behavioral Connections and the Women's Residential Treatment Program is certified by the Ohio Department of Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services (ODADAS), and the Joint Commission.

Payment Options

Payment arrangements are made on an individual basis. We accept Medicaid and self pay. Wood County residents may qualify for a sliding fee scale.

Devlac Hall Women's Residential Treatment Program is funded primarily by a grant from ODADAS. Additional funding is provided by the Wood County Alcohol, Drug Addiction, and Mental Health Services Board.

Removing Barriers to Treatment for Women

This 10 week residential program for women age 18 and over is designed to meet the challenges that women face in accessing treatment for alcohol and drug addictions. These challenges include financial ability, family, childcare and transportation issues. Aftercare is provided in the woman's home county.

Residents of Wood County can take advantage of the Extended Care Program which provides:

- Safe housing for 6 months after the Residential Treatment Program is completed
- Support for resident employment
- Continued counseling for chemical dependency and mental health issues



Family Visits

Family members are encouraged to participate in the scheduled Family Education programs and may visit with residents after these sessions. Devlac Hall is located at 1033 Devlac Grove (off of W. Gypsy Lane Rd.) in Bowling Green, just a short drive from the junction of I-75 and St. Rt. 6.
